



WHAT IS Corva?

The California Off Road Vehicle Association (CORVA) is a varied group of outdoor recreationalists who are extremely active in promoting the positive aspects of vehicular access on public lands and protecting that right.

The group is composed of the owners of "Green Sticker" vehicles such as ATV's, motorcycles, 3-wheelers, trials bikes, and dune buggies, as well as "street-legal" 4X4 vehicles, dual sport motorcycles, bajas and desert racers.

The main purpose of CORVA is to work with the land managers for responsible off-highway vehicular access and recreation opportunities. Secondarily, we educate our membership on the constantly changing rules and regulations and promote conservation, clean-up and trail maintenance projects.

We are very active in the political arena and pay for a lobbyist in Sacramento. We work closely with the State Department of Parks and Recreation providing input to the Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation (OHMVR) Program from the users' standpoint. We provide a valuable resource to land managers in the form of dedicated OHV enthusiasts who believe in responsible vehicular access.

A portion of the budgets for California's national forests and the public lands administered by the BLM is funded by grants from the Green Sticker Program. We work with the land managers to formulate the grants and give our input about the grants to the OHMVR Program which administers them. We also review how effectively our Green Sticker money was used in each program.

We are active at all levels of the land management public process with both the BLM and USFS. We do this by commenting on environmental documents on as many issues as possible and maintaining close relationships with personnel in the field as well as the staff.

We coordinate with other multiple use organizations ranging from snow-mobiles to horse enthusiasts to protect multiple-use rights from the environmental extremists. We are "dedicated to protecting our lands for the people, not from the people."

Truckhaven

12th Annual Truckhaven Challenge is Ready to Roll!

Final plans are nearly done and the 12th Annual Truckhaven Challenge is going to be another great one! In fact, we are planning for this to be the best one yet!

For those that have not participated in this event before, here is an overview.

The Truckhaven Challenge is usually held on or about the 3rd weekend in January each year (January 20-21 in 2007) just west of Salton City, California. The terrain is primarily decomposing, dry mud hills with some sand washes and rocky sections thrown in for good measure. The area is laced with trails ranging from tight and twisty to steep and hairy. In other words, great off-roading!

It is in this ever-changing terrain that we mark an approximately 20 mile course (changing it each year) for the Saturday Poker Run. There will be several checkpoints. At each checkpoint you will draw a card to assemble a poker hand, and also participate in a "game of skill". The top three winners of both the poker hands and game scores will all win great prizes! There will also be marked "Alternate" routes which will be much more difficult than the main route. These are for those folks really keen on abusing their vehicles! After the run we will have a BBQ dinner prepared by the Trailmasters Club, and a drawing for great prizes donated by the off road industry!

The event is open to all Off Road vehicles, but please remember not all four wheel drive vehicles are suitable for off road use. Stock SUV's with novice drivers run the biggest risk of getting stuck/damaged. Similarly, young children on 50cc- 60cc bikes and ATV's may have a problem with some hills and technical spots. While we test the course with a high-clearance Jeep in 2 wheel drive and open differentials, this does not mean the run will be easy. We do this so we feel the course "should" be navigable by most 4 wheel drives and other OHV's. Since there is no way we can anticipate the experience level of every rider/ driver, please consider this paragraph as a "heads-up"!

We promise you will be kept busy all day and boredom will not be an option!

Back by popular demand for 2007 will be the Satellite Safari. The Satellite Safari is for those people who have jumped on the hot GPS (Global Positioning System) bandwagon and are having fun utilizing orbiting satellites to determine their position in the backcountry.

Using your portable or built-in GPS units, you will be sent on a "treasure hunt" into the hills of Truckhaven to find......something. You will have no course markers or maps, but will follow only the directions on your GPS screen. Pick your own route! This is great fun! Not sure how to use your GPS unit in the "Go To" mode? No problem! We will show you how in an informal meeting an hour before the Safari starts!

The Satellite Safari will be held on Sunday, January 21 between 9:00 AM and Noon. Participants will have enough time to run the Safari before they need to pack up and head for home.

At press time we are putting together a vendors row and an area set aside for clubs to set up a booth and promote their membership.

Also back for 2007 will be a great Sunday morning breakfast to benefit CORVA's N2Dirt educational program. CORVA President Ed Waldheim will be the master chef for this, and those of you who chowed down his breakfast at last year's event know this is not to be missed! And don't forget we will have our traditional Sunday morning kid's games after breakfast so the little ones can run around and burn off some of that great food!

Please note that in July 2006 the CORVA Board of Directors voted unanimously to require CORVA membership (beginning in 2007) to participate in CORVA events. CORVA membership covers the whole family so multiple vehicles (example: Mom and Dad in a jeep and the kids riding ATV's) are included.

CORVA is spending over \$6,000 per month on legal and lobbying issues now, and while our attorney David Hubbard has been doing an outstanding job representing OHV interests, the bill is daunting. So to make a long story short, we need the money and want our participants to be fully informed on OHV issues.



What's it Going to Hurt?

Recently, we were doing a trail work party on our adopted trail in the Kennedy Meadows area. We try to go up as often as we can to maintain and improve the trail where it is needed. This time was especially rewarding, we needed to work on a couple of areas where the creek crossed the trail. The area had rutted a bit, and with higher than usual water levels, it made the crossings very difficult. We went in and added cinder block grids to harden up the base under the water. This works very well, raises the path off the creek bottom and reduces disturbing the soil as motorcycles, people or mountain bikes cross. As usual, as we worked riders would pass through and reward us with the appropriate amount of praises and "atta boys and girls" for doing such needed work.

That afternoon while out enjoying the trails ourselves, we again ran into a group of riders, who now recognized us as the heroes that we were, so we stopped and chatted for awhile. They included a very nice man and several kids from Torrance also enjoying the trails of the area. Our talks covered everything from the weather to how hot it would be riding in El Mirage about now with the 100 plus degree temperature, and after a few minutes we again parted to go about our intended paths.

The next day brought new trails and a renewed level of energy to our oxygen starved blood cells, from the 8500 foot elevation. The sky was filled with puffy white clouds and the forest was fresh with the smell of pine. Our ride was typical for the area, perfect.

It was about this time that we ran across an unusual thing. There was an official looking sign with Forest Service logos saying something like "Trail Closed – Trying to give the forest a break from OHV" stapled over the trailhead sign. Now realize that this was "our" trail, the one that we have adopted, and if anyone should know if it was closed or not it should be us. I am not sure, but this seemed to be an attempt by someone to mess with the legitimate trail system that is in place. I have heard of several instances of Eco-Terrorism acts against off-roaders. If this was such attempt all they would have accomplished would have been to either send riders down a Class 2 road risking their lives from traffic, or sending them across open forest to locate another open trail.

Either case would be illegal; knowing that they could get a ticke some would choose such an action anyway. Or they would sa "this sign can't be true" and go ahead down the trail. This "cryir wolf" and thereby encouraging people to break the law, on erodes the impact of true and legal signage. I don't think that th action would be in the best interest of anyone. The best thing for the forest would be to encourage riders to stay on the designate trails. In fact the more and better designated legal trails there are the less illegal trail activity there would be.

I really don't understand the "Anti-OHV" thinking. Since 1980 the population in California has grown more than 55%, 17% of all households participate in OHV recreation, yet the number of acres available to OHV has decreased by 6.5 million acres in the California Desert alone. The trend is to provide less and less area for OHV recreation, while the number of registered off-highway vehicles has increased statewide by



more than 80% in twenty years! This only increases the usage and demands upon the few areas that are left. The less leg riding areas we have, the more illegal use of other areas an incurred.

Mankind needs to recreate. It is a psychological need for humans to leave the crowded confines of the cities and recreate Mankind does not do well if boxed in, overcrowded and unable express freedom. Our population is going to grow, we can not stop that, but we can manage our recreational needs and plan for the future. We need to learn to share our public lands and operareas for all forms of recreation.

I consider myself an environmentalist. In fact, I did belong the Sierra Club. I went to college in Forest Management and Recreation. I have studied the impacts upon society and have seen affects of recreation in the outdoors. The bottom line, we

must recreate, we must provide adequate space for recreation, and we must manage the impacts our recreation causes. Additional law enforcement or closures of recreational areas are not always the correct answer for a problem that will not go away. The problem will only increase as the population increases. When one area is squeezed, it only bulges out somewhere else, legal or otherwise. Riverside and San Bernardino counties are having a similar "OHV problem". The best answer would be to provide more adequate managed space for recreation, instead of closing areas, or creating new laws that are unenforceable. Laws like that will only make your next door neighbor a law breaker. Being forced into breaking laws



else from the candidates. (You get enough info. from the other associations and newspapers regarding a candidate's stance on schools, taxes, quality of life issues, etc. so we don't bother with that.) Those candidates that answer favorably to questions about our sport, they get endorsed.

Now, if you have a candidate that is not on this Voter Guide list that you feel should get our endorsement, we encourage you to go talk to them and have them fill out the questionnaire. Or, if they did reply already and are negative toward OHV issues, it is your job to make sure you change their mind by giving them information on why you recreate with your family using your off road vehicles. It is as simple as that. They will listen to you, because you are a voter in their district.

So get involved by walking precincts for a candidate in your local area, make phone calls for them, stuff envelopes for them if you want to be "behind the scenes". This is one of the most important things you can do to protect your riding areas and it costs you nothing from your checkbook. If you don't do it, guess what? You may just get to stay home and cover your toys in the garage, because there will be no one fighting for us in the State Capitol or Congress and all our riding areas will be closed permanently. Are you willing to lose it all?

only erodes the respect for the laws and the law makers.

Let's get back to that nice guy from Torrance. Just as we were finishing up our pre-determined loop for the day who should we run into again, but this nice guy from Torrance. This time he had at least eight young riders all on green sticker dirt bikes. The problem was he was on a Class 2 road getting ready to head off with his pack in tow. I stopped and asked if he knew that that was not a green sticker road and he should not be riding there. He felt that his chances of getting a ticket were slim, and he just wanted to show the kids something and "What's it going to hurt?" It became obvious that he was not interested in listening to me and he was still going on his path. In frustration I rode on.

It was not until later that I realized what the answer to "What's it going to hurt?" was. If you actually get all eight kids back alive without being hit by some unsuspecting car or logging truck, what have you taught them, these future off-roaders? Did you teach them that just because you are on a dirt bike, and you just wanted to see something over the next hill, that it is OK to break the law? How about, "No one is going to see me, so it is OK." Just what are you teaching these kids?

I realized that the road they were getting ready to go down was the same road that the suspected fake trail sign was posted over the real trailhead sign. What do you think the person that put that sign up would say about a band of law breaking dirt bikers? He, this nice guy from Torrance did not understand that the simple actions of a few are seen as the whole. His actions could very well affect the future, if not the lives of those he has in tow. And his actions could have an affect on my continued use of this beautiful area.

I kick myself every time that I think about my failure to convince this nice guy from Torrance how much damage he was doing. Of course I do not carry a badge or a gun; I only have my words and my example to make an impression. Unlike the Ecoterrorist I won't break the law or cause damage or harm to someone to make a point, but I do kick myself that I didn't have at least a few more words for this nice guy from Torrance to help him see our future.
