WHAT IS Corva?

The California Off Road Vehicle Association (CORVA) is a varied group of outdoor recreationalists who are extremely active in promoting the positive aspects of vehicular access on public lands and protecting that right.

The group is composed of the owners of "Green Sticker" vehicles such as ATV's, motorcycles, 3-wheelers, trials bikes, and dune buggies, as well as "street-legal" 4X4 vehicles, dual sport motorcycles, bajas and desert racers.

The main purpose of CORVA is to work with the land managers for responsible off-highway vehicular access and recreation opportunities. Secondarily, we educate our membership on the constantly changing rules and regulations and promote conservation, clean-up and trail maintenance projects.

We participate in lobbying activities in Sacramento and Washington, DC. We work closely with the State Department of Parks and Recreation providing input to the Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation (OHMVR) Program from the users' standpoint. We provide a valuable resource to land managers in the form of dedicated OHV enthusiasts who believe in responsible vehicular access.

A portion of the budgets for California's national forests and the public lands administered by the BLM is funded by grants from the Green Sticker Program. We work with the land managers to formulate the grants and give our input about the grants to the OHMVR Program which administers them. We also review how effectively our Green Sticker money was used in each program.

We are active at all levels of the land management public process with both the BLM and USFS. We do this by commenting on environmental documents on as many issues as possible and maintaining close relationships with personnel in the field as well as the staff.

We coordinate with other multiple use organizations ranging from snowmobiles to horse enthusiasts to protect multiple-use rights from the environmental extremists. We are "dedicated to protecting our lands for the people, not from the people."

bicyclists, and anyone who loves the Great Outdoors.

When I was on the OHMVR Commission, Past Deputy Director Dave Widell had a vision, a vision for all users of public lands to work together and try very hard to make a difference. He advised me over and over and over again to work with the environmentalist instead of ignoring them. He said if you all work together, you can really make a difference in OHV.

I followed Dave's advice as much as possible. It brought a lot of criticism from the OHV community, and after awhile they beat you down with criticism. It did not help when we lost our California Stakeholders meetings, where we always expressed our opinions openly to the environmentalist and others in the Stakeholder group. GET MULUED OHV Lobby Day Off-Roaders Meet Legislators & Lobby For Our Sport

On April 7th, 2008, the California League of Off-Road Voters (CLORV), of which CORVA is a founding member, hosted its 14th Annual OHV Lobby Day. Members from all over California representing all major off-road vehicle associations joined forces to "Walk the Halls" and meet their legislators.

Activities began on Sunday, April 6th at 5 pm when lobbyist Pete Conaty & Associates held a Capitol Advocacy Orientation at a nearby hotel. Pete provided insight as to how to interact with a legislator and his or her staff members. This training is helpful to first-time participants and allows all participants to meet each other and share experiences.

On Monday, participants were treated to breakfast at the CSAC Conference

Center one block from the State Capitol. Following breakfast participants heard speeches from dignitaries such as Ruth Coleman, Director, California Department of Parks and Recreation, Daphne Greene, Deputy Director, Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation Division, Joel Anderson, Assemblyman 77th District (La Mesa, El Cajon, Santee, San Diego). Next a buffet lunch of beef and chicken fajitas were served. At 1 p.m. participants were split into geographical teams and visits to the Capitol began.

Members hiked around the building visiting legislators' offices and educating them on off-road recreation issues. OHV Lobby Day has three priorities:

1) Train our members on Adopt-A-Legislator concepts by getting the

members comfortable with speaking to their legislators,

2) have the legislators see that offroaders are professional, family people with careers and are not like the media portrays us to be, and

3) Educate legislators on our position on new bills. Each year the bills change which makes this event interesting year after year.

This year, off-roaders were lobbying the bill SB.1228. This bill would extend the existing law requiring parental supervision from age 14 to age 16; require riders to provide a safety certificate to law enforcement personnel on demand; and requires ATV riders to follow guidelines for appropriate sized ATV's per the following: 1) Age 6 and older – under 70 cubic centimeter engine 2) age 12 and older – 70cc to 90cc, 3) Age 16 and older – over 90cc.

We lobbied that we currently oppose this bill unless it is amended. Off-roaders provided legislators and staffers with statistics and safety data to support our opinion and further stated that existing law already requires ATV certification for children. It is our duty now to continue this lobbying in the local offices of our legislators.

At the end of the day, off-roaders and legislators attended the CLORV Legislative Reception at Chops Steakhouse. We had a private lounge to host our dignitaries and enjoyed the intimate setting to meet and greet the legislators and staffers on a personal level. Here, CLORV announced its "Legislator of the Year' awards. It is invigorating to know how many legislators support our grassroots efforts to keep public lands open to public access.





Stewards of the Sierra National Forest and Racers under the Son are newly formed off-highway vehicle clubs in Fresno that have organized to work with the Forest Service to help maintain roads and trails in our National Forest.

The two organizations recently partnered with the Sierra National Forest Bass Lake Ranger District to clean up the forest around the Bass Lake district. More than two dozen volunteers spent the morning and hot afternoon picking up trash and debris that had accumulated along the roads and trails.

Two truck loads of trash were collected and removed, including half of a car body, a 15'x 12' roll of carpet, old car engine parts and discarded tires. Although it was a hot weekend, everyone pushed through the heat and worked as a team. Volunteers enjoyed hot dogs and drinks provided by RUTS and SOTSNF. The combined cleanup efforts paid off and a noticeable improvement was made to our public lands.

Both organizations are looking forward to the next opportunity to help with keeping their beloved trails clean.





Washington State Governor Christine Gregoire exercised her line-item veto of a measure that would have banned all construction of new trails or facilities for off-road motorized recreation for at least a year.

The measure, which had been inserted in the state budget in a last-minute maneuver, without the opportunity for public debate, would have prohibited the state's Department of Natural Resources from building or expanding trails or facilities for off-road recreational vehicles until July, 2009. It was one of seven sections of the proposed capital budget that Gov. Gregoire vetoed.

The AMA and other organizations spread the word of the legislature's maneuver. Nearly 500 people used the AMA's Rapid Response Center to send messages to Gov. Gregoire, urging her to veto the measure. Others helping rally support for a veto were the Northwest Motorcycle Association, the Washington Off-Highway Vehicle Alliance, the Washington Road Riders Association, the BlueRibbon Coalition, the Motorcycle Industry Council, the AMA District 27 organization and Americans for **Responsible Recreational Access. Notices** were also posted on the popular Thumper Talk and KTM Talk internet forums.

Look at the work the Friends of Jawbone are doing to keep folks from riding off of the Designated Trails, only to be bashed on the *Thumper Talk* website by riders who state, "They are closing our trails." Well I have news for OHV folks, those are not your trails; they have been closed since 1986, but you just will not listen or read.

Look at the article in the *Daily News* April 9, 2008, "Straying Hikers hurting sensitive areas in Griffith Park". Yes, trail boss leaders say it is boring to stay on the existing trails, thus they take liberty to take more challenging ways up the mountain. They stated that if they have to stay on a road, they may as well go to a gym and watch the girls in leotards. This statement came from a Sierra Club trail boss. Now they should know better than that. Look at the trails that bicyclists are making. There are now new trails and down hill runs in Angeles National Forest created by mountain bicyclists.


